## CHAMBLEE COUNCIL ELECTS MAYOR PRO TEMPORE; SWEARS IN COUNCILMEMBERS

January 23, 2020— The council elected Brian Mock as their Mayor Pro Tempore at their regularly held council meeting on Tuesday, January 21, 2020. This is second time Councilmember Mock has held this title. Mock was first elected to the Chamblee City Council in November 2013 and holds an At Large seat.

The City of Chamblee swore new and returning councilmembers Thursday, January 16, 2020. Councilmembers Leslie Robson and Darron Kusman return to the council. Robson was first elected to the council in November 2007 and serves District Two. Kusman was first elected to the council in November 2015 and serves as an At Large councilmember.

Karen Lupton is the newly elected councilmember for District Three. She served as the president of the Chamblee Middle School Education Foundation and volunteered as the director/co-director for the Chamblee Fun Mud Run. Lupton is a 2017 graduate of the WIN Leadership Academy, a program offered by Georgia's WIN List to prepare progressive women to run for elected office. She earned her Bachelor's of Arts in Vocal Performance from Eastern College. Lupton now works as Coordinator of the Songs for the Seniors Program at A.G. Rhodes Health & Rehab, a nonprofit provider of rehabilitation and long-term care services for senior citizens.

Chamblee City Attorney Joe Fowler swore in the councilmembers.
