CITY OF CHAMBLEE CUTS RIBBON ON DRESDEN PARK

December 8, 2016—City of Chamblee Mayor Eric Clarkson and Chamblee City Councilmembers cut the ribbon on the newest addition to its park system at Dresden Park on Tuesday, December 6, 2016. The 24-acre park was acquired in early 2016. It offers soccer fields, an ADA playground, concession building and restrooms, walking trails, pavilion and picnic tables and benches throughout the park.

“We’re excited about the addition of this neighborhood park,” said Mayor Clarkson. “It brings wonderful opportunities to the community. We are still in the process of making improvements, such as reseeded the field, which will offer better playing experiences in the fall of 2017, but in the meantime, our residents can enjoy other amenities and as always, nature’s beauty.”

Some of the refurbishments the City of Chamblee Parks and Recreation Department already made to Dresden Park prior to opening include: removing hazardous trees, repairing the playground, painting the concession building, renovating restrooms, posting signs and rules, replacing railings and repairing trip hazards on sidewalks.

Chamblee Parks and Recreation is responsible for eight parks totaling 76 acres. Dresden Park is located at 2301 Dresden Dr. in Chamblee.
